

GRADES, DEFINITIONS AND SYMBOLS

Definitions of Grades

The results of the legacy GCSE examinations are reported on an 8-point scale of grades: A* (a*), A (a), B (b), C (c), D (d), E (e), F (f) and G (g).

The results of new GCSE examinations regulated by Ofqual are reported on a 9-point scale of grades: 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 with 9 being the highest grade achievable.

Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for G or 1 receive no grade and a subject receiving no grade is not recorded on the certificate.

Double Awards

The results in these specifications are reported on a 15-point scale of grades: A*A* (a*a*), A*A (a*a), AA (aa), AB (ab), BB (bb), BC (bc), CC (cc), CD (cd), DD (dd), DE (de), EE (ee), EF (ef), FF (ff), FG (fg), GG (gg).

The grade is recorded twice on the certificate to indicate that the results in these specifications have the same status as GCSE grades in two other single-certification subjects.

GCSE Short Courses

The Short Course is designed to cover not less than half the specification content of the corresponding full GCSE subject course of study and the same grading standards are applied. The GCSE (Short Course) is, therefore, broadly equivalent to half the corresponding full GCSE.

Spoken Language

Spoken language is not counted towards the final grades in the new GCSE English Language (601/4505/5). The result is reported below the overall grade as Distinction, Merit, Pass or Not Classified.

Qualification Accreditation Number

A Qualification Accreditation Number is printed against each subject title on this certificate where the specification has been approved by and details included on the register of the relevant Regulatory Authority.

Qualifications Wales regulates this qualification where it is awarded to learners assessed wholly or mainly in Wales.
